ENTRY

Guests may enter via the ground-level front doors or the building's west side stage door (adjacent to the parking lot).

LIFT

Chair-accessible elevator is located at ground level, at the front of the building at the east corner. Controls are designated in Braille, in addition to the standard buttons.

RESTROOM

Accessible restroom is also located at ground level, at the front of the building at the east corner.

SEATING

Accessible seating is available for all shows on a first-come, first-served basis on the main floor level. Be sure to mention your need for wheelchair accessible seating or other accommodations when placing your ticket order.

Audio assist devices are available for the hearing-impaired during all performances. Please inquire with box office upon arrival.
